Garden Ponds

All types of ponds have a significant benefit to wildlife, no matter what their size. They provide habitats where

amphibians can breed, where insects can live or visit, and a place where birds and mammals can drink or feed. It is said that a pond in your garden is the single best wildlife habitat that you can create, and I believe that to be true. It is also true that many people say how much they would like a pond, but for many good reasons do not quite get to the point of creating one! So, this article is to try and encourage you to take the plunge and create a pond, no matter how small or how large, in your garden. A pond does not have to be difficult to create, even a mini pond in a trough or bucket will attract wildlife.

There are a few basic rules: you need to ensure creatures can get in and out easily by having at least one sloping side, that they are in a suitable location with plenty of sunshine, there is at least 75cms depth, that there are suitable plants both in and around the pond and of course that you have a seat near the pond to sit and wonder. You will need some more information than that and thankfully it is easy to find. There are many sources - you can do an online search for creating a wildlife pond or go to a book shop and you will find all the information you need. These will give you options on materials and construction. Equally a pond does not need to cost a lot of money or take up a

lot of space. A basic pond with the right conditions can work very well.

We have two small ponds in our garden, one of which is circular. approximately 5ft (1.5m) across, and a smaller pond which is pear shaped, approximately 3 feet (90cms) by 18 (45cms) inches. Both ponds were dug into the ground with varying depths and a sheet pond liner used. They needed a bit of effort to dig, a small cost to purchase the felt. liner and some plants, but in



basic terms that was it. Interestingly, the newts appear to prefer the smaller of our two ponds.



The rewards for wildlife, and us, are immense. We see a lot of breeding damselflies and dragonflies which use our pond as both a breeding and feeding area. This year there has been a greater number of smooth newts and for the first time we have seen them with their young in the smaller pond. We see many insects and birds drinking from the ponds, especially finches, blackbirds and various types of wasps, hover flies and bees. In late spring and early summer, larvae and nymphs emerge from the pond and climb up the taller plants to undertake an incredible transformation into insects such as mayfly and dragonfly. You can sit and watch this unfold in your own garden. What more can you ask for?

In addition to all this there is another world on and under the water. You may see pond skaters, great pond snails, whirligig beetles and other life - such as flatworms – that you may not see until you do a pond dip. How all these creatures find their way to your pond you will probably never find out, it is truly fascinating. Sitting by the pond, relaxing and observing all the wildlife, is one of the most stress relieving things you can do. So, all I can do now is say, 'Make some Space for Wildlife', and put a pond into your garden.


Olveston and Tockington WI

St Peter's Hospice

A Volunteer

I always seem to have been involved in voluntary work in some way or another from my teens until the present day..... way beyond my teens! Once my youngest child started school, I felt I was able to give more time and commitment to at least one charity. I found a couple of adverts in the Gazette one week and made a few calls, one of which led me to working for Young Lives vs Cancer (previously known as CLIC and then CLICSargent). I worked with them for 18 years in their warehouse at Filton, but then sadly COVID resulted in the closure of many of their High Street shops and my job no longer existed. The Volunteer Manager at the time, however, secured herself a promotion within another charity and took me with her.

I now work for St Peter's Hospice at their warehouse, undertaking the same role as before, which is dealing with new goods rather than charity donations from the public. If you visit and support any of the local St Peter's charity shops, most of them will have a section of 'New Goods' such as Christmas cards or pocket money toys. From September to December my main role is to fulfil any orders from their website, from their online shop or catalogue - mainly Christmas cards. For the rest of the year my tasks vary from stock taking to order picking and allocating the new goods to various shops according to their orders.

I thoroughly enjoy my weekly visit to the warehouse, I have made new friends, learned some new skills and gained a far better insight into the tremendous work that they do for our part of the country. St Peter's Hospice currently has over 1200 volunteers and people may be surprised to learn that much of their work (approx. 90% I understand) takes place in people's homes rather than the hospice building itself. St Peter's is always looking for volunteers and if retail isn't for you, then there are several roles outside of the shops that you could get involved with, for example administration, gardening at the Hospice, or working in the Hospice Café.

Jacks in the Belfry?

Well, not perhaps in the belfry, but certainly in the roof of St Mary's.

Jackdaws are noisy birds, (jack jack!) black with grey heads, who like nesting in buildings. At my home they pack twigs all the way down the chimneys. At St Mary's they had pushed their way past the wire mesh defences at the west end of the nave roof and, rather than a proper nest, had piled up sticks into a large untidy heap.

The rooves of nave and both aisles were replaced in 1955 which, at about 70 years ago, means these rooves need to be watched carefully for deterioration. At the recent inspection of the interior of the roof, which is required every five years, these previously unknown heaps of twigs were discovered.

Getting the sticks out proved to be a problem since access to the restricted space at the far west end of the nave roof is along crawl boards from the distant door, and the prosect of hauling large dumpy sacks by hand did not appeal. After some thought it was decided to erect a scaffold tower and remove some slates from the roof, gaining access from nearer the site of the heap, which was successfully completed, and the slates replaced. Having been carefully imported into the roof by the not very big birds, the photo below shows one of the three bags of kindling that we removed.



As the inspection of rooves proceeded it was found that the blighters had done the same thing at the east end of the south aisle roof, so the action had to be repeated there too. If jackdaws were not such a nuisance, they would be admired for their persistence. The vents through which the birds had forced entry have now been thoroughly protected.

The chancel roof is going to be the next concern. It was not reroofed in 1955 and since the tower was destroyed in 1605 there has been no access to the interior from the tower at all and since it now has an arched plaster ceiling there is little roof space to access. The slated roof is not in the best condition and the church has had problems with



internal damp which necessitated the replastering of one of the chancel walls. It was decided at that time that the problem had been caused by blocked gutters which was fixed, but there may have been internal damage to the roof structure. This roof will be inspected too, and scaffolding will once again be used, this time from a tower on either side, allowing a visual inspection.

Such is the nature, complexity, and age of our lovely old building that there are challenges to be solved all the time.....watch this space!

Olveston and Tockington Methodist Church - Property Update Jennifer Bone

Last Autumn our Church Council decided to reduce the number of our premises (we have two in Olveston and two in Tockington), and we invited anyone interested to express a view on the choice to be made. Thank you so much to all of you who responded.

This review has been in effect a re-run of the review which we had undertaken in 2019-2020, at which point lockdown and the pandemic prevented us from implementing the changes planned for 2020-2022.

The decisions taken by our Church Council in June this year are built on these earlier decisions, this time for 2023-2025. We are aware, however, that today our Church's resources, both human and financial, are significantly reduced from where we were in 2020.

In Tockington, the Chapel on the Green remains our priority for investment and improvement to ensure its future. The Wesley Rooms will also be maintained for their substantial community use. There will be a further assessment in 2025.

In Olveston the position is more complicated; although the site consists of two distinct buildings, with separate deeds, it can only operate as a combined site,



as the facilities are all in the Hall. We do not have the resources to continue to maintain the Hall, which needs substantial expenditure. The Church Council agreed more time for consultation on the prospect of partnerships which would make it practical and worthwhile to upgrade the Chapel into a multi-purpose small hall for religious and community use. We would use the same scheme which was due to proceed in Summer 2020. A decision on whether this is feasible and has sufficient support will need to be reached by the end of 2023. The alternative is the closure of the whole site.

In January this year we gave an assurance to users that premises will remain available at least until Summer 2024. Our timetable for implementing the Review takes us to 2025. Our warmest thanks to everyone who has taken time and trouble to show interest and give us assurances of your support, which have influenced our planning.

Alveston Repair Café

A Volunteer

"If you can't repair this don't worry. I will just drop it off at the tip on my way home".

I have had this conversation with repair café customers more times than I can count. But it is sometimes surprising what we are able to achieve, and it is a very satisfying feeling to see a happy customer take their item home ready to be used once more!



Repair cafes are increasingly popular in this country and indeed in Europe and our humble efforts have been well attended and have given much enjoyment to both customers and volunteers. I noticed that Alveston is full of middle-aged. retired, grey-haired men (and it was mostly men) who have shedloads of tools and like taking things apart (just like me!). I decided that if I could recruit five friends to be volunteers it would be worthwhile to try to set up a Repair Café. I had 20 names within a few days. The range of skills was a relief and there were several ex-aerospace professionals. It is basically DIY, but that covers a lot!

At our last event in May, we looked at about 50 items and were able to repair 40% on the day and 30% were retained to repair later. We also gave repair advice on a further 10%. There were, bicycles, CD players, trousers needing new zips, lamps, vacuum cleaners and goodness knows what else.

It's not just about saving things from landfill. We also thrive on sharing skills between the volunteers and encouraging the customers to pick up new skills too. But above all it's about having fun. It is always gratifying to hear the hubbub of conversation and even see some customers getting involved with their own repair. The atmosphere of the events is always cheerful with lots of lending of tools and opinions.



Both the repairs and the refreshments are free, but we ask for a voluntary donation to help with costs. Our next event is on the 7th October between 10:00 and 13:00 at St Helen's Church in Alveston. Everyone is welcome. Bring something you would like repaired or just come to see what is going on and enjoy some coffee and cake.

Bedward Jenner: a man who changed the face of the world.



In 1796, Dr Edward Jenner of Berkeley proved that inoculation with cowpox protected against smallpox, a terrifying scourge that killed one person in twelve. Vaccination has proved to be one of the greatest success stories in medicine, culminating in the complete extermination of smallpox in 1980. Professor Gareth Williams tells the colourful story of Jenner's life as a doctor, scientist, musician, poet – and a disorganised experimenter - who took over 30 years to put his cowpox theory to the test.

Gareth Williams trained in medicine in Cambridge, London and Geneva and was Dean of Medicine at Bristol University and Chair of the Trustees at the Edward Jenner Museum. His books include Angel of Death: the story of smallpox, Paralysed with Fear: the story of polio, A Monstrous Commotion: the mysteries of Loch Ness and Unravelling the Double Helix: the lost heroes of DNA.

Tradition is an important part of life, whether that is of family, nation or culture. Saint Paul recognised the importance of tradition in the handing on of the Faith. He was most concerned that the Faith he preached was what he himself had been taught, as he wrote in one of his letters: "This is what I received from the Lord and in turn passed on to you."

The tradition of the Church is twofold: there is the oral tradition and there is the written tradition. The oral tradition is what has been handed down through successive generations by word of mouth. This was the way primitive tribes passed on the story of the tribe's history to new generations. The position of Storyteller was one of high status in ancient tribal life. He or she was the one who passed on to future generations the stories of the past, keeping alive the tribe's history. It is said that at the heart of every legend there is a grain of truth. The problem was that though many of the stories may have been based on real-life experiences, over time they became so distorted as to become quite unbelievable. Quite simply, the story is changed in the telling.

Oral (as in spoken) tradition on its own therefore is flawed. However, this is where the written tradition comes in. We know it as the Sacred Scriptures, the Bible. The pages of the Old Testament contain the history of God's chosen people. And then in the years following Christ, the infant Church recognised the importance of writing down first hand experiences of Christ and the teaching surrounding his coming by people like Saint Paul. As the eyewitnesses were becoming fewer in number with the passage of time, it was important to put in permanent form, what they could remember before it was too late. In this way, a reasonably accurate picture could be passed on down the line of subsequent generations. These pages make up the second part of the Bible we know as the New Testament.

On its own, the written tradition of the Church is confusing and difficult to understand. The oral tradition, therefore, expands and elucidates, but it can never wander too far from the truth because it is in constant reference to the written word. The two work together. Through our tradition of prayer and worship and study of the written word in the Bible, we show and keep alive what we believe, and hand on to future generations. Our belief in the Eucharist and the living presence of Jesus among us is revealed. And so, we ourselves, like Saint Paul, are able to pass on to future generations what we ourselves have received.
