#### **Foodbank**

Thank you to everyone who donated to the food bank over the Christmas period. As can be seen by the letter below it means so much. If you are able to donate, we are continuing to collect in the church porch. A list of items that are particularly needed is on the porch notice board.

#### A Huge Thank You from Thornbury Foodbank

We have been overwhelmed and are so grateful to our community for the amazing support you have given to Thornbury Foodbank since the start of the pandemic. It has been such a difficult time for so many people in the locality which means that so many more families and individuals have benefitted from your support through donations both financial and in kind.

From 27 March 2020 to 11 December 2020, we have fed 711 adults and 307 children, issuing 12.48tonnes of food and essential items and received 13.28tonnes of donations. Compared with the same period last year all these figures are up by over 50%. We also purchased 1.76 tonnes of extra items made possible by amazing amount of financial donations we have received. These extra items include fresh vegetables, bread, spread and items where we were low in stock.

It is impossible to thank each individual personally so we would like to thank everyone who has donated to the Foodbank from individuals to local businesses in our locality for their generous donations of food and money.

We do, however, want to thank Tesco Thornbury for their support. We have a collection basket situated in the store where donations can be left. We have built up a good relationship with their Community Champion who ensures our monthly list of needs is made visible on the basket.

The photograph below illustrates some of this generosity as it shows the extra parcels we were able make up of Christmas items donated and bought from financial donations which we hope brought some loving care into those lives for whom Christmas would not have been a happy time.

We are also most grateful for our team of dedicated volunteers who have freely given of their time during these difficult times.



So, on behalf of all of those benefitting from your kindness we want to say thank you for making life a little easier than it would have been without your support.


Carolyn has held numerous jobs within the Care sector over the last 15 years. She has worked for many years at Emerson's Green NHS Treatment Centre as a Health Care Assistant on

the wards, followed by an engagement and marketing position explaining the hospitals NHS services. More recently Carolyn has worked in a Breast Cancer Care role providing face to face advice to patients following surgery and ongoing treatments and care.

2020 was the year of unprecedented changes beyond the control of many people including herself. Carolyn could see the need for help and assistance for the vulnerable and isolated people in our community and surrounding villages and decided to see if she could help in any way. She placed adverts locally and used the Olveston Community Village Face book page to promote her services explaining that she can provide an extra pair of hands and a friendly face to help people remain independent within their own home setting. Sometimes it is not just the physical restrictions that need to be met but often the emotional isolation that people are presently experiencing at this time along with loneliness and being restricted from having visits and support from family members and friends that are now unable to visit and travel .

Carolyn takes pride in being seen as an extra extension to family support - it may just be a simple 'pop in' visit and a smile, a chat over a cup of tea, simple tasks like putting the dustbins out, feeding the birds, shopping, cooking, picking up prescriptions, helping with house hold chores and even trips out and about to visit places (when present restrictions are lifted of course). The simplest of things, and sometimes a trouble shared, can often have the biggest impact on people and make a bad day turn into a positive one. Carolyn has said that all the people she regularly visits have become dear friends, it cost nothing to put a smile on someone's face and that is always her main objective.



### Animals are not just for Christmas

At Meeting Point we really appreciate contributions from the younger members of our community. We were therefore very pleased when Lily Purchase, aged 9, who lives in Olveston, got in touch with us about her concerns for badly treated and neglected animals. Here is what she wrote..........

With my school I recently wrote a letter to the local MP and to Battersea Dogs Home. I would like to raise awareness around the importance of adopting dogs and cats and making sure it's the right decision. I also wanted to help raise support to build more shelters for dogs and cats as I see so many homeless animals on the streets of Bristol, which makes me feel very sad that they do not have a home.

This is my letter to my local MP:

Dear Luke Hall.

My name is Lily and I'm 9 years old and I'm concerned that animals are not getting a good amount of food and care. I saw this cat with a person and the cat was following me and the person kicked the cat out of the way. It made me upset because people shouldn't be mean to animals.

Firstly, we would like to discuss the main topic which is dogs are not just Christmas or lockdown but they are for life. This leads to abandonment of lots of animals on the streets in the freezing cold. Animals should get food, water, love and a bed.

I would like you to create more shelters for the animals, especially cats and dogs because people will buy them from the shelter. I want you to help me spread the message across Olveston about a dog not only being for Christmas but for life by advertising the message on magazines and TV.


Dear Battersea.

### Who was the Jamaican Miller of Tockington? Nick Fear

Milling and mills have been connected with the Tockington area for centuries. Grain was at first crushed using hand powered stone grinding wheels, called querns, a laborious and exhausting task. The process was later mechanised and there are at least four windmill sites recorded in the area. These were in turn supplanted by water powered mills, alongside which are family surnames associated with the trade. The Esworthys, Lippiatts and, perhaps most

The first recorded water mill in Tockington was at Brook Farm at the entry of the village. The leat which channelled water to turn the mill machinery still exists, most obviously between the front of the farm and footpath. Strangely the flow seems to go against the downward gradient before disappearing below ground. The water course can be traced back to the fields below Tockington School playing fields. The remains of a sluice gate and the mill pond can be found, both now in disrepair although the water flow still exists.


remembered of all, the dynasty of the Grosvenor family.

With time and mechanical innovations, a larger mill was needed and at the beginning of the nineteenth century a mill was built close to the valley below Hardy Lane. The water course from Brook Farm was diverted in an engineered way, doubling back on itself under the road, to flow into the fields beyond. Its pace and power is still evident today and pushes clean water to, and far beyond, the mill site.

In 1861 Samuel Grosvenor and his wife Ann worked the mill and had five children living with them. Samuel had been born in Devon, Ann was from Worcestershire, but the census record intriguingly shows that whilst three sister siblings were local girls, William and his brother Samuel were born in Jamaica. This was definitely unusual for that era, as Jamaica is a long way from Tockington and both boys had been baptised in Olveston. The explanation is linked to the shameful history of the slave trade.

Jamaica was, for centuries, associated with the production of sugar, coffee, cotton and other exotic items. Several nations had fought to dominate it for its bounty and the English Crown took over in the mid-1650s. The terrible side to the production of goods on the island, was that it was achieved using slave labour. The horrors of this are well documented, and the trade was abolished in 1807. Sadly, the institution of slavery was not ended, and it continued until the total abolition in 1834. Even after abolition, many freed slaves had no choice but to continue working for their former masters and the situation was complex and occasionally volatile. Some years later, businesses in Jamaica put out adverts in British newspapers about jobs for people with agricultural and managerial skills. The adverts gave information on inexpensive boat



passages to the island, and rumours spoke of the great financial rewards, even fortunes, to be made.

Samuel and Ann must have been an adventurous couple as, after their marriage, they set off to Jamaica. It seems that they had arrived in the early 1840s after a journey which could take up to two months. The couple settled in an area then known as Wisconsin, working on a ginger farm. The times in Jamaica were unsettled, with clashes between freed slave workers and immigrant groups. Overall, politically, there was a movement for more independence for the island, which caused tension to the extent of riots. Cyclones and other weather disasters hit the island, the climate in general tested inhabitants causing disease and premature deaths. Beyond its shores other countries were developing similar farm crops, produced at a cheaper rate as they used more modern techniques. Samuel and Ann started a family and worked hard for around eight years before returning to England, with enough savings to invest in their own mill.



In 1863 Samuel died, aged 46, and their son William took over the mill. He married a local girl, Fanny Lippiatt, and they set up home in the mill. The family prospered and William took on modern innovations in the business. Around 1874 a steam engine was installed at the mill to improve efficiency and solve the problem of summer water shortages. It made excellent business sense, but it also portended a stroke of sad fate. In 1889 a tragic, terrible accident occurred in the mill. William had been altering the drive bands connecting the machinery to the engine and, somehow, he became attached to them and was drawn into the mechanism. His son working outside, realising a blockage in the system, found a terrible sight and went for help. William had died instantly; he was carefully taken from the mill with the assistance of two

men who were working nearby. An inquest held at the Swan Public House recorded a verdict of accidental death for William Grosvenor, the Jamaicanborn miller of Tockington.

The story continues with William and Fanny's son Samuel, the first Samuel's grandson, who took on the family business. In 1909 he married Laura Mills, a girl from Oldbury on Seven, and they moved from the mill premises and set up home nearby. Samuel improved the business; steam power was replaced by a Blackstone diesel engine in 1912. He worked the mill until his premature death in 1921, aged 45, from the dust induced 'miller's lung'. The amount of dust at the mill had always been noted and caused problems for workers.

The Grosvenor family continued to have a stake in the working of the mill. It did valuable work throughout the Second World War, producing mainly food for cattle. Cider was also made there, which was very popular with local licensed premises and private buyers. Photographs of the mill taken around the mid-1950s (see example below) show the building, particularly the roof, in a neglected state, although remnants of the original mill machinery were still in place. The link to the Grosvenor family lasted until 1966, when the site – by this time used only for storage - was sold.



A surveyor's report from 1977 detailed the poor state of the premises and listed walls and chimneys having fallen. It noted a plan to turn some of the buildings into accommodation and supported the need to preserve such an important village structure.

Today the mill

has been skilfully restored and it is now a solid desirable dwelling. The old iron water wheel, which had once been a modern replacement for the original wooden one, is still in place. The mill leat still flows nearby at speed but does not move it.

### OPTA Update

Our annual AGM is normally held towards the end of November in the White Hart, Olveston. Obviously, for reasons that are all too familiar, this did not happen in November 2020! We are obliged to hold an AGM within 15 months of the previous one, which means we have until just before February 24<sup>th</sup>, 2021. So, in the light of the current lockdown, we will review the situation and decide how to proceed. In the meantime, just like most other local clubs and organisations, all our activities are on hold.

### Some Local Geology

Hamish Orr-Ewing

Anyone looking at the geology map of this part of the country would be struck by the kaleidoscope of colour which reflects the large number of rock and soil types in the area. In fact, Bristol and its surroundings probably has more varied geology than any other region in Britain. Most people take it for granted – or don't even notice it – as it is all around them and always has been. Yet local geology has shaped our lives, whether it be the type of house we live in, the availability of water supply, the type of farming that can be carried out or the presence of mining and quarrying.

Some of the earliest rocks in the area are the mountain limestones which you can see in the Avon Gorge and the Mendip Hills. They were formed about 280 million years ago as coral formations in shallow seas. They are slightly soluble in acid rainwater which gives rise to cracks and fissures which eventually enlarge to form large caves such as those at Wookey Hole, If the water reevaporates out, the limestone is redeposited and tends to form the calcium carbonate 'glue' which makes rock rather than a granulated soil. Much of Olveston sits on grey limestone, and you can see it peeping out of the highway verge in Denys Court as well as in exposures in many local guarries. Of course, it is the stone from which most of the early village buildings are constructed. Nowadays most of the market for quarried limestone is for roadstone and concrete aggregate. The limestone which was originally laid down horizontally was later affected by subsidence and horizontal pressure and was squeezed into giant corrugations. The 30° dip that you can see on the limestone face in the Avon Gorge is evidence of the massive scale of the movements involved.



Towards the end of the carboniferous limestone era, the climate changed, and land surfaces became heavily forested swamps. Successive layers of organic material built up in what is now known as the 'coal measures.' These were later eroded back to the limestone in the Olveston area, but further east they remain in a band from Cromhall down to Syston and formed the basis of Bristol's coalmining industry which worked coal from 1250 to 1968.

The eroded limestones were overlain later by Triassic mudstones, which have remained as horizontal strata to this day. The most recognisable feature of the

material is that it is red, due to its high iron content and this has given rise to many local placenames such as Redcliffe, Redland and Redfield in Bristol. The Triassic strata was formed approximately 180 million years ago in desert conditions and may vary from sandstone, loose sand, mudstone to clay. The clays are used for brickmaking and hence the presence of a clay pit and brickworks on Over Lane. This was originally set up to provide millions of bricks for the construction of the Severn railway tunnel, but the business continues to this day.

Where the Triassic overlays the limestone, it has filled up the limestone fissures and penetrated areas of limestone scree weathered from limestone cliffs. This gave rise to another rock type - conglomerate, which looks like a pink concrete with grey limestone aggregate. Occasional lumps of it can be seen in the St Mary's Church boundary wall on Church Hill, contrasting with the grey limestone of the remainder. (Not a geological matter – but of interest - this wall is capped with blue coping blocks which were cast from molten slag which was a by-product of the once thriving Bristol brass industry.)

The Triass is in turn overlain by Lias clay strata of a yellow/grey colour. Within that there occur isolated layers of fossil-bearing limestones. The best place to view this is either side of the first Severn Bridge, where the cliff face shows a

neat section. The beach below is littered with fossils from the limestone layers, particularly after heavy rain and freezing conditions. If you take children there, armed with bucket, hammer and safety goggles, you will be guaranteed to find fossil shells and even some bones. The picture below shows fossil-hunting in progress. The limestone layers were popular as building stone as they had naturally parallel sides. There are some modern houses faced with this yellow limestone opposite the Olveston village shop.



The last geological period since the iceage has involved substantial sea-level rises as the ice began to melt, and this is still ongoing, being given an additional recent nudge by manmade global warming. As the sea rose, rivers backed up and silt was deposited over the previously eroded land surface. The depth of silt at Avonmouth is over 80ft, showing that the Avon Gorge was originally much deeper. The silt formed flat flood plains either side of the Severn as far as Gloucester and beyond. It extends to the foot of Church Hill in Olveston and can be viewed by walking on Catherine Hill.

Left to its own devices, this area would be flooded by the higher tides each year, with a little more silt being deposited each time. However, man has intervened and constructed a flood embankment which extends from Avonmouth to Gloucester. The addition of rhine drainage has allowed the former marshes to be turned into agricultural land. Anyone walking at Whale Wharf may observe tidal flotsam which has, in places, been deposited within inches of the top of the embankment, suggesting that raising it is long overdue.

### Wildlife in the Garden

This article first appeared in February 2018.

Although we are past the worst winter weather it is a good time to start planning our gardens and if we are to entice birds and other creatures it is worth giving some thought to what we should plant.

For with a little forethought and by planting the right bushes they can provide benefits to wildlife in the garden the whole year round. The blossom in spring is a magnet for bees and other pollinators, and the foliage provides a haven for many different insects and a hiding place/larder for birds.



Native species such as Hawthorn and Ivy fare well in the garden and provide a better insect habitat than some more exotic species. By observation Holly, Pyracantha and Cotoneaster provide good berries and, judging by the way the Redwings scoffed the berries from my Mum's Pyracantha must be very tasty. But also, as an extra benefit plants such as the Cotoneaster brought in so many types of bees, I really needed a dedicated book to identify them (there are 600 species of bee I was told).

Do be aware that some of the plants mentioned are prickly and although they suit the wildlife, they are not always human friendly (as I know from my Mum's Pyracantha). But you may console yourself with the thought that you have planted a beautiful plant and one that will create a space and a larder for wildlife for years to come.

When a firm has a wagon with a load to be delivered and has no driver. the company may well contact an agency for a driver at short notice. Some time ago, I was speaking with a manager about the agency for lorry drivers he was involved with for several years. He and a business partner were running their own company and as they developed and expanded, they invested in a uniform for their drivers. I asked him one day how the drivers felt about being required to wear the uniform. His reply was simple and straight forward: they like to feel they belong. The uniform, together with its business logo. and designed after consultation with many of the drivers, gave them a sense of pride of who and what they were and who they worked for. To belong gets right to the heart of who and what we are as human beings. Through belonging, we find our identity and express the wish to be treated the same as others in the group.
