Green Force

The Green Force Group has been awarded a Bronze Medal by the Diocese of Bristol, to mark the efforts made to bring awareness of the environment

to St Mary's Church in Olveston. This has involved reviewing the energy use

within the church building, sensitive mowing of the churchyard to encourage wildflowers and wildlife, and offering recycling facilities.

Last month the group visited the UrbaseR Waste Unit (which sits beside the M5 near Gloucester)

Did you know... this unit is the only one in northern Europe and is therefore unique to the UK?

While there we were given a detailed talk followed by a conducted tour round the huge buildings. In a nutshell, this is what we learnt... HARMFUL \rightarrow BENEFICIAL \rightarrow HARMLESS.



Black bin rubbish arrives and is incinerated, giving off heat to make steam to drive a turbine to make electricity which feeds into the national grid. The remaining ash is sorted. Any metals remaining are sent for scrap. A material for road

construction is separated off and any remaining ash is treated so that the only emission issuing from the tall chimney is steam. The result of this intense process means that absolutely nothing goes to landfill nor does anything toxic go into the atmosphere. Building of the unit started in 2013 and took 3 years to complete, it came online in 2017 and will have paid for itself in 6 years.

All members felt reassured and very well informed by the visit. We hope that many similar units will be built across the UK in the future.



Mike and Mo Lewis

Mike Lewis



Mo Lewis has been prominently featured in the local social media and press pages a great deal in recent months, as she worked hard to make a success of her fourth Christmas Toy Appeal on behalf of the Salvation Army, a charity ensuring that needy children wake up on Christmas morning to find new toys! "With 16 grandchildren in our extended family, I knew none of them had ever gone without, especially at Christmas. I was shocked to read just how many children had little or nothing, and that Christmas Day was

nothing special in their sad lives. I thought I would try to help just a little". That proved to be a huge understatement. In each of the first three years, around £2,500 was donated. Christmas 2021 shattered those impressive statistics! In a quite remarkable show of support from the local community over £10,000 in new toys, toiletries, Boots vouchers and cash was handed over.

Shortly after the Lewis's arrived in Olveston in 2011, Mike was persuaded to be chairman of The Friends of Daldry Gardens social group. "I was reluctant to take on another role, to be honest", says Mike. "I had spent a lifetime being involved in one thing or another and, having just survived a serious cancer battle, I was looking for an easier life in a lovely village". But Mike did take the role, and Mo became Treasurer. The residents of Daldry Gardens, and a rapidly growing group of other Olveston folk enjoyed their coffee mornings each week and embarked upon numerous regular, varied activities together. This included bingo, quizzes (of course), race nights, excursions, pub meals, Wii sessions, indoor bowls and one memorable Christmas lunch Mo cooked for 22 people, before professional caterers took over to make life easier in later years.

When lockdown finally ended in March 2021, Mike and Mo decided to hang up their organisers' hats, after 10 years at the helm. "We had done so much in a decade, had fantastic support from some wonderful people, several of whom, had sadly passed away or moved into care. We decided it was an opportune time to take a break. It seemed especially appropriate as the face of Daldry Gardens had changed a great deal, from a supported housing scheme for elderly people, into an independent living project".

During lockdown Mike had written and published four Amazon quiz books. The first of those was Quiz Builder, with local question master Chris Smart, with whom Mike and Mo had become friendly whilst helping Chris run his regular entertaining quizzes at St Mary's church. Together with son Rob, Mike and Mo

had been presenting quizzes around the west country and Wales for almost 30 years. Many of those were for charities, raising tens of thousands of pounds in the process. The trio known as The Inquizitors presented quizzes in some major venues, including Celtic Manor, the National Museum, Cardiff, Doubletree Hilton Hotels and Bowood House. Mo was the adjudicator, probably the most pressurized job, where up to 450 quizzers were answering competitively to win!

Mo and Mike attended St Mary's, where Mike was a server, prior to a double knee replacement. Rev. Roly Bain was approached to become President of The Friends of Daldry Gardens. He readily accepted and was a wonderful presence until his untimely death. Verger June Robbins succeeded Roly and carried on the good work, including the continuation of her long-established monthly Holy Communion in the communal lounge.

The Friends of Daldry Gardens formed strong links with the community, especially Olveston Primary school. To the delight of residents, children from the school choir visited and sang on special occasions. A strong bond was also formed with the 1st Olveston Scouts. As Treasurer, Mo ensured that the group enjoyed some wonderful social occasions, as well as supporting some great causes. Two variety shows were memorably staged in the church as fund-raisers for both organisations. One was a huge success and the other - well, the less said the better! It was just one of those bad dates. Mike took the loss on the chin.



Mike had been commercial director at football clubs including Forest Green Rovers, Swindon Town, Bristol Rovers and Exeter City; another fund-raising string. With Mo's help he then instigated, co-ordinated and presented the very successful half time draw at Bristol City FC for 25 years. Almost 1.5 million tickets were sold and, to mark their retirement. Mike and Mo were rewarded with a presentation of engraved Bristol Red Glass by club owner Steve Lansdown at a special ceremony in the board room.

Mike and Mo have said it was a great move, coming to the friendly

village of Olveston. They have met so many lovely people and enjoyed so many occasions. There would, most definitely, be no returning to the city!

Making Space for Wildlife

It's National Tree Week, and a proverb that springs to mind is "The best time to plant a tree was 20 years ago. The second-best time is now."

As readers of Meeting Point may recall, one of the aims of the Making Space for Wildlife project is to plant more trees in the Parish. By the time this article goes to print, we are pleased to say there should be seven new trees planted in two locations. The first location is at the top of Orchard Rise where an English oak, field

maple and a small-leaved lime tree have been planted. At the junction of Pump Lane and Alveston Road, two small-leaved lime trees, a sweet chestnut and another English oak should be bedded in for the winter. In the coming years we would like to plant more. We are always interested in hearing suggestions for new tree locations on public land, so if one springs to mind then please do get in touch with the email address listed below.

Trees are vital for restoring biodiversity and combatting climate change. The UK Government has set a national target to increase woodland cover in England from 10.1 % to 12 % by mid-century (or very roughly, that's an extra 250,000 hectares of woodland). By 2030, South Gloucestershire Council is aiming to plant sufficient trees to double canopy cover. In Olveston Parish, Castle School sixth form pupil Charlotte Lambie, estimated tree cover to be 4.6 % in an investigation she undertook to complement her studies (thank you for letting us share this information Charlotte). It is not difficult to see we need to increase the number of trees in the Parish to help meet these objectives. Whilst the project's focus is on planting trees on publicly owned land, there is a huge role for parishioners to play by planting trees on privately owned property too.

Because we'd love not only to have more trees in Olveston Parish, but also to have an idea of how many are being planted, we would like to keep a tally of new trees planted. Therefore, if you plant a tree and would like it to be counted in the parish tally, please let us know about your new tree by emailing olvestonwildlife@gmail.com.

In a tree-mendous ending to this article, we have heard from several parishioners who have taken tree planting to another level. Between them, they have planted approximately 1000 trees recently. These plantings involved members of the community including Duke of Edinburgh volunteering efforts, local Scouts and Cubs who created 'Scout Wood', plus a local Forest School



Hedgehog update

Thank you to all those who have sent in their sightings, stories, photos and even videos of the hedgehogs that live amongst us in Olveston Parish. Since the call went out in the October

edition of Meeting Point, residents have reported about 12 sightings (it's never going to be terribly precise as hedgehogs like to move around a lot!) We expect that with the colder weather sightings will become much less frequent, but please do send us your information if you spot one. We are logging the sightings on the Hedgehog Street's 'Big Hedgehog Map', which is publicly available, see the link below. If you have seen a hedgehog and would like to record this, there's two ways to go about it.

The best way is to record the hedgehog yourself online via Hedgehog Street's Big Hedgehog Map, which is easy to use. You will need the date of sighting, location of sighting and whether the hedgehog was alive or not. See https://bighedgehogmap.org/

The alternative is to send the information to us on olvestonhedgehogs@gmail.com and we can help to log the sighting. Please let us know when you saw the hedgehog, whether it was alive or not, plus a description of its location. A photo, drawing/map or screenshot would also be useful.



ST MARY'S CHURCH TOWER RESTORATION PROJECT

St Mary's Church Restoration Project

Perhaps you thought we had finished?

The tower was 'topped out' in a ceremony in early November and the old pinnacles were sold for the amazing sum of £1,200 each. The clock now has a new face, and the works are updated so they can be wound automatically. The tower has now been restored and it was rededicated in church in December, whilst the wonderful new pinnacles and their crockets have become an ideal perch for the local jackdaws! Our thanks to all who have given and

organised, and to the Tower Team for their good work so far.



But more is still to come, with the provision of foundations that the external stair tower has never had – indeed it is not at all clear how the tall tower has stayed upright, since it is unconnected with the main church building against which it leans and down which it has been very slowly sliding, we assume ever since it was built, perhaps 200 years ago.

The 'Tower Team' will continue their work, with some more complex 'raking shore' scaffolding to stop the stair tower falling over. Only about half of its existing circular walls sit on the ground – seeming never to have had any foundations – so we are having new foundations added, very, very carefully.

Thornbury Rotary Still Collects Old Tools

Last year Thornbury Rotary reported that they were collecting old tools to pass on to 'Tools for Self-Reliance'. They had a tremendous response to that appeal and wish to thank everyone who supported this initiative. In 2021, Thornbury Rotary has extended its support to 'Tools with a Mission' (TWAM).



TWAM gathers donated tools, refurbishes them, sorts them and packs them into trade packs that can be used by workers in poorer countries. They currently work in 17 countries, but by far the greatest number of tools goes to four countries in

Africa, namely Uganda, Democratic Republic of Congo, Zambia and Zimbabwe. The trade kits are targeted at agricultural workers, builders, carpenters, electricians, motor mechanics, plumbers and garage workshops. They also supply sewing machines, knitting machines and fully working computers and IT equipment. Last year TWAM was able to send 1500 tool kits

they could hear about the children's concerns, and to answer questions from children about what is being done to address this issue.

Prior to the event, each school was asked to do three things. First, to make a short video about climate change and biodiversity loss; the actions they and their schools are taking; and the help they need from leaders and politicians. Second, schools were asked to make a set of school pledges to act or step up their current actions on climate change and to say what help they need from leaders to fulfil these pledges. Finally, pupils were invited to take part in a poster competition with a theme of 'What a green future looks like to me'.

Local politicians and leaders who either spoke at the meeting or who sent messages of support via video were Dan Norris (West of England Combined Authority (WECA) Mayor), Matthew Riddle (South Gloucestershire Council (SGC) Councillor), Maggie Tyrrell (SGC Councillor and Thornbury Town Councillor) and Guy Rawlinson and Clive Parkinson (Thornbury Town Councillors).

Olveston Primary School's pledges were made by individual classes. Year 3 Goldfinch class pledged "to plant bee friendly plants and flowers around our school and local community", whilst Reception Class pledged "We will recycle our food waste from snack time". Year 6 Swift Class pledged to walk or cycle where possible especially on Fitness Fridays, and the Year 2 Robin Class pledged to plant seeds and grow their own food. Year 5 Wagtail Class committed to recycling and reusing especially paper used in the classroom. as well as litter picking once a week! Year 1 Kingfisher Class said they will turn off taps and not waste paper and Year 4 Starlings pledged to plant seeds, plants and to make space for nature.

At the end of the summit the winners of the poster competition were

announced. One of the winners was Megan from Olveston School, (her poster is shown on the right). Well done Megan, and all the pupils at Olveston School who sent in entries, the judges had a very difficult time choosing the winners.

Sustainable Thornbury would like to say a huge thank you to all the children who took part in the Schools' Climate Summit, and to all the teaching staff who helped them prepare their videos, posters and pledges. The knowledge and enthusiasm of all those who attended was very impressive and our planet will be in good hands if this is a sign of things to come.



The presents have been pored over, the turkey eaten, the New Year celebrated: it feels like the season is ended: and it feels like the 'Bleak Midwinter' stretches endlessly before us.
