

Tockington's Hidden History: Washingpool Hill Sheepwash

On Washingpool Hill Road, opposite the driveway up to Sheepcombe House (originally Farm), is a low stone wall. Behind the wall is an ancient sheepwash. On either side the road verges are common land, so it is likely that this was used by a number of farms, notably Sheepcombe Farm and Home Farm (opposite Tockington Manor). Sheep would have been ushered into the wash




from the western side of Washingpool Hill Road, and probably exited on the eastern side, but no evidence of an exit point remains. It first appears on a map dated 1844. (At the end of this article is some detailed information on the history of sheep scab.)

There are two water feeds into the sheepwash which travel under the road from Sheepcombe House driveway. The stream provides the water to Tockington Mill Rhine which starts on the Lower Tockington Road. The walls of the wash, which are about 4 feet high, are constructed of part dressed local stone. One imagines that it would have been more practical

to have built a rectangular structure, but for some odd reason there are 5 walls plus the roadside wall. Today, parts of the stonework have been washed away but the majority remain in place. One important stone, however, has fallen into the stream. It is a sluice gate stone, one of two which, when fitted with a metal plate, created sufficient depth of water for the sheep to be thoroughly dipped. Local residents know that the roadway here often floods in times of heavy



rainfall and it is probable that the sluice gate stone was deliberately knocked over to allow the sheepwash to drain more guickly after its use was discontinued.

Judging by the type of stonework, the map and the history of sheep dipping in this country, it is probable that the sheepwash was built early in the first half of the 19th century. There is historical verbal evidence (Meeting Point) that its use ended in 1944. The roadside wall was constructed by South Glos Council some 20 years ago to prevent cars from sliding off the road into the sheepwash in icy conditions.

Sheep scab is one of the oldest known diseases of sheep and is probably the same as mentioned in the Bible (Leviticus 22,22) and, according to Kirkwood4, was also discussed by authors such as Cato (180BC) Virgil, Pleno and Columella. The word "scab" is derived from the Latin scabere, which means to scratch. Despite the fact that the mite is visible to the naked eye it was not identified as the cause of sheep scab until 1809 by Walz.

Dipping by total immersion was not introduced until 1800. This was an arduous task because it was usually done in a tub. Dipping below ground level did not become popular until the middle of the 18th century after the method had been widely used in Australia.

Is there an end to the Allotment Season?

In November there was an article explaining how one plot holder approaches the winter. Our approach is different......we consider the cropping of the final courgettes, cucumbers and squash as the virtual end of the season although root vegetables, especially the parsnips, stay in the ground until after the first frost. For this reason, root vegetables are planted together and other crops in different areas from previous seasons.

Plans are made at the beginning of the season. We rotate crops to prevent disease and to allow us to manure parts of the plot each year according to what we will be growing. We don't grow brassicas, making it possible to rest some areas. Some people plant onions and broad beans (sometimes referred to as 'winter deer food') in October, but we do not.

As part of our end of season tasks, we put an agricultural membrane down on all cleared areas of the allotment. This material is rather expensive, but it has lasted for 30 years. It covers the land preventing weeds from growing, allows rainwater to permeate and keeps the soil underneath in an excellent condition for the next season. It isn't pretty, nor does it kill bindweed or couch grass, but it does weaken them and when the membrane is lifted, the earth underneath is in a condition that allows the weed roots to be extracted, but never totally! This membrane is available to allotment holders at a reduced-price from the garden centre.

Of course, there are areas of the plot which are never covered – where fruit such as raspberries, strawberries and rhubarb are growing. These areas give places for bugs and birds to feed. We try to balance our needs with those of wildlife.





The exceptional life of a female industrialist: Lady Charlotte Guest




Dowlais Ironworks

GKN is a globally successful local aerospace company with its roots going back to the Dowlais Iron Works near Merthyr Tydfil. The company name, GKN, derives from the amalgamation in the early 1900s of different companies: the Dowlais Ironworks owned by the Guest family, the Patent Nut & Bolt Company owned by Arthur Keen, and Nettlefolds Ltd, makers of wood screws (some of which you may still have in small boxes in your shed, workshop or garage). Guest, Keen and Nettlefolds became GKN in 1982 when it moved into the aerospace sector. GKN factories at Filton and Western Approach, Severn Beach, are nowadays internationally significant manufacturers and assemblers of aircraft wing components.


But this all started with an ironworks near Merthyr Tydfil, founded in 1759. The owners appointed John Guest as manager eight years later. He took over the company, which was dramatically expanded in the next century by his grandson, John Josiah Guest, partly thanks to his relationship with Isambard Kingdom Brunel. Dowlais Ironworks provided iron for his Great Western Railway and also supplied iron rails to burgeoning railroad companies in the USA, Germany and Russia. Lady Charlotte Guest, John Josiah's wife, kept a very close eye on the company accounts and described a contract made in 1844 to supply 50,000 tons of rail to Russia as "the largest contract of the kind






ever made." As a result of the railway-led boom, Dowlais had, by 1845, become the largest ironworks in the world.

On 7th January, Dr Victoria Owens will tell us more about Lady Charlotte Guest who, for three years, on the death of her husband in 1852, headed up this company. Under her management, Dowlais became the world's largest manufacturing company.

She wasn't an obvious candidate for such a role. Her aristocratic Lincolnshire family had looked on with dismay, nineteen years earlier, when, at the age of 21 she had married the wealthy Welsh ironmaster of Dowlais. Her family was somewhat impoverished but Charlotte, who had had a brief flirtation with Disraeli, seems genuinely to have married John Guest for more than access to his wealth. Theirs was a real partnership. She increasingly acted as his assistant at the ironworks and together they



started building schools for the workers' children. Charlotte, in particular, invested enormous energy in building good-quality schools and a library for local people.

She embraced her life in Wales, becoming very knowledgeable about the company's business and learning Welsh in order to be able to speak to the workforce (not difficult for someone who had already studied French, Italian, Latin, Greek, Arabic, Hebrew and Persian!). She associated with leading Welsh literary scholars and she so took to the Welsh language that she translated a collection of medieval Welsh stories, which she published in seven volumes as The Mabinogion and which became hugely popular.

Seven years after the last volume of The Mabinogion was published, Charlotte's husband, John Josiah, died. She was then a young widow of 40 - and, incidentally, the mother of 10 children. She took up the reins at the ironworks at a difficult time. She had to negotiate strikes and a slump and stand up to other foundry owners. She managed to stabilise the business so that it could be handed over to her eldest son and the works manager, leaving her free to start a new life.

Come along on 7th January to hear more about this amazing woman. Victoria won the 2021 Wales Book of the Year Non-fiction Award for her biography of Charlotte Guest. Copies will be available to buy, should you wish.



Action at the Armstrong

Since the last bulletin in the October magazine, work has continued non-stop on the renovation of the Cossham Hall and the creation of the new bar, kitchen and fover. Significant milestones have been the completion of most of the internal walls, insulation of the fover roof and installation of most of the cables and main pipes. The next stage, starting in November, was the installation of the new bar and kitchen and the final roof repairs to the Cossham Hall including the restoration of the vaulted ceiling.

All of this has been made possible by Maggie Lansdown's generous gift of £1.25m in memory of her mother, and after much persuasion, she has given her permission to call the main hall the Lansdown Hall in recognition of her invaluable support, without which this project would have been impossible. Maggie has visited to see progress and meet the team and was impressed by their enthusiasm and commitment to the project. The whole venue will be known as The Armstrong in honour of Frank Armstrong's generous legacy to the town more than 50 years ago.

The focus for the Armstrong Team now is on raising awareness and support in the community along with raising the vital £1.1m needed for the renovation of the larger hall. This will be needed for the provision of new flooring and roof insulation, as well as installing a greener and more efficient heating system. So several of the team have been out and about gathering support and giving out information and contact details. The Armstrong had a stall at Love Thornbury's Vintage Car Event on October 18th and at the Christmas Lights Switch-On event on November 15th. The response from the public has been very positive and many thanks go to Thornbury Christmas Lights Association for donating the proceeds of the day to help with funds for The Armstrong project.



Phase 2 is vital for the future of The Armstrong: we need to provide the large space to bring back the community activities which have been lost due to closure and provide a fitting arena for the talented drama and musical groups, including Thornbury Arts Festival, which have given the town such joyful delights over 50 years.

It is hoped that the Cossham Hall and Foyer will be in operation in



Cop 20 to Cop 30

Last November, 2025, COP 30 was held. In December 2014, COP 20 took place. The principal goal of the conference 20 was to reduce greenhouse gas emissions to limit the global temperature increase to 2 degrees

Celsius above current levels. At 2025's conference the intergovernmental panel on climate change remembered that it had recommended in COP20 that developed countries must reduce emissions by at least 25% below the 1990 level by 2020, which has not been achieved. It is now recognised that limiting global warming to 1.5C requires huge, rapid and sustained reductions in global greenhouse gas tare of mother nature emissions to reach net zero carbon dioxide emissions by 2050. At COP30 hopes that countries would commit to end use of fossil fuels and halt deforestation were once again dashed after opposition from petrostates. Key countries such as US and India were absentees from the conference

Globally extreme weather in the form of floods, hurricanes, wildfires and drought cost over 2,300 billion in 2024, hitting low-income and vulnerable countries the hardest. Thousands of people die as a result every year .These weather extremes continue as I write. Deforestation of the Amazon (including in Brazil where COP30 was held) continues at a fast rate.

COP30 set a new target to triple the finance for climate adaptation. It falls to the wealthy nations to finance the poor. In an era of trade wars and tariffs, negotiators also agreed for the first time to hold discussions on how trade policies can help or hinder climate action. Against the backdrop of the Amazon, nature may also see some advances in conservation by including a new fund for tropical forest conservation. Indigenous peoples and other local communities were recognized like never before.

By the end of COP30, 119 out of 194 countries attending and representing 74% of global emissions had submitted new national commitments. However, they will collectively deliver less than 15% of the emissions reductions required by 2035 to hold global temperature rise to 1.5C. The United Nations analysis suggests that the world remains on course for at least 2.5% degrees C of warming between now and 2050. A central and politically charged issue was how the world would address the continued use of fossil fuels which is the root cause of the climate crisis. No conclusion was reached.

Whatever the twists and turns of climate negotiations, the economic transition is slowly underway, but the question is how fast will it be and who will benefit? Now is the time for countries to go into action and fulfil their promises.



When midnight arrives, fireworks light up the night sky with bright colours, welcoming new hopes and opportunities. People celebrate the new year in different ways. Some host parties, dance, enjoy delicious food, watch fireworks, or spend time with friends and family. It is a joyful time to come together, have fun, and maybe share a kiss at midnight with a loved one.

Many New Year's traditions began long ago. Making resolutions at the year's start is a Babylonian tradition. Creating loud noises with fireworks began as a way to chase away evil spirits in pagan customs.
