



Hedgehog Update

Thank you to all those who have sent in their sightings, stories, photos and even videos of the hedgehogs that live amongst us in Olveston Parish. Since the call went out in the October 2021 edition of Meeting Point, residents have reported nearly 20 sightings (and we

know there are more).

Now the weather is warmer, more hedgehogs are on the move, and we'd like to know where. If you spot a hedgehog, please consider logging the sighting onto the Big Hedgehog Map (see links below) or if you prefer, send us the details and we can do it for you. The email address to use is: <code>olvestonhedgehogs@gmail.com</code>. Send details of where and when you saw the hedgehog and whether it was alive, dead or roadkill.



The aim of this 'citizen science' project is to build up a picture of where hedgehogs are being seen in our villages. We will use this information to work out which roads are the most hazardous to hedgehogs.

Here's an extract of the Big Hedgehog Map: the red and pink circles show where hedgehogs have been spotted.



Glyn Roylance - Thornbury Radio Champion Bernard Amos



Most people now know that Thornbury Radio is now broadcasting 24/7 in competition with Heart, Greatest Hits Radio etc, but probably don't know that one of the key champions and drivers to create it lives in Olyeston.

Glyn Roylance was born in St Helier.....no, not the capital of Jersey, but St Helier hospital in Sutton/Carshalton. However, he was only there for 6 weeks

before the family moved to Downley near High Wycombe This is where he grew up. He went to school there up to middle school, but then had to travel to Aylesbury by train and bus, setting off at 6am and getting back home at 6pm.

Glyn has always been fascinated by the magic of wireless communication by radio technology, so he went up to Manchester University to understand more by reading Electrical and Electronic Engineering, whilst dabbling in pirate radio running a student radio station! It was there that he met his future wife, Suzanne, who was studying Medicine.

After university he landed his dream job with the Independent Broadcasting Authority (IBA). He must have made a good impression, because of 1000 people who applied only 10 were accepted, one of whom was Glyn. The IBA was focused on commercial broadcasting (radio and TV) and eventually became OFCOM having sold off their transmission interests. He says this job took him all over the country whilst Suzanne was now a junior doctor mainly in Chester and the Northwest. His first 18 months were mainly at the IBA training college in Devon and Newcastle Polytechnic, with placements in Yorkshire at the iconic Emley Moor transmission tower near Huddersfield. At the time this was the tallest free standing concrete structure in the UK at 330metres (1084ft) high and was built to replace an even taller metal tower that had collapsed in 1959.

Glyn describes his time on that project as 'brilliant' however his next placement was in Croydon - 200 miles away from Suzanne - so the job was no longer a dream. After a short time he got a job with Cable TV in Liverpool and

moved to Pensby on The Wirral.....much closer to Suzanne, who was now a practising GP in Winsford and eventually they moved to Sandiway near Northwich in Cheshire. However, he found the culture at Cable TV very unprofessional and after 9 months he moved to a startup company called Microtel, which first became Hutchinson Microtel and eventually became Orange.

This was an exciting time, as the technology for mobile communications was developing rapidly and there were lots of technical hurdles to address with constant innovation and, of course, there was pressure to keep ahead of the competing mobile networks. Glyn became a radio network planning engineer.... finding sites for transmission masts all over the North of England. This involved him using his love of maps and computer modelling, combined with being outdoors. However, he was too successful and was promoted to Network Planning Manager for the North of England, Scotland and Northern Ireland meaning he now had 70 staff and was involved much more in meetings rather than being out in the field.

By now Orange was growing very rapidly and he then got his second 'dream job' as National Network Performance Manager, which involved optimising network performance. If you had a dropped call in this time, Glyn says it was his fault! Orange had been the last of the main mobile networks to launch and within two years had grown to be the biggest and, in those days, the best performing network, which he found very rewarding, especially being involved with some of the marketing, including major campaigns on TV and other media.

Things started to change as the internet bubble began in 1999/2000, Orange changed ownership several times, eventually ended up being part of France Telecom. By now his job involved a lot of trips from Cheshire to Bristol, so it made sense to move, which is how the family came to Olveston. He was now Radio Network Design manager, liaising with the regulatory bodies and setting the basic technical policies for the various regions. He and Suzanne had a growing family; Sam, Greg and Jenny, with Suzanne taking on a locum role in several GP practices in the South Glos. area.

Glyn's next job was with Orange (Global) heading up their New Radio Technology activities which involved identifying the potential of 4G and 5G (long before most of us had heard of them). This role involved lots of international travel, mainly to Paris, and did wonders for his French language skills. After nearly 30 years Orange consolidated its business to Paris and Glyn grabbed the opportunity to get redundancy and retire!

In his spare time Glyn had been doing some freelance technical consultancy with various small radio stations around the UK and then, in 2005, he saw an article in the Gazette about Rev. David Primrose, vicar of St Mary's Thornbury, who was planning to launch a community radio and Glyn volunteered to help.

This was successful, having started the project in March, Thornbury FM launched in November. However, the regulations meant that Thornbury FM could only broadcast for one month at time and only twice each year, but Thornbury FM kept going until 2010 and Glyn considers this a successful period with hundreds of people involved in keeping things going. Towards the end of this period Glyn was becoming very busy in his 'proper job' and he had to suspend his involvement. Thornbury FM then applied for a full licence to broadcast, which was rejected on the basis that there were no spare frequencies, so the station limped on for about another year then folded as the rejection and battles with the regulators had knocked all the enthusiasm out of the team.

In 2015, Glyn was becoming very frustrated with the situation of Thornbury being denied its own radio voice, so he rolled up his sleeves and wrote a technical White Paper to demonstrate the fallacy of the claims of there being no frequencies available. Then began constant (polite) lobbying; he involved Luke Hall MP and wrote repeatedly to the key people – his theory being that if he made enough of a nuisance of himself, this would break the back of the denials of frequency availability. His persistence paid-off and eventually Thornbury Radio gained a licence for not just one, but two frequencies.

An internet only service was launched in 2017, and then Thornbury Radio went live in June 2021 on 107.5FM (Olveston, Almondsbury area) and 105.1FM (Thornbury area). Glyn says the whole purpose of the station is to be Thornbury's voice - help local businesses network and provide free publicity to local not-for profit organisations on the Community Spotlight segment. The station has been very active encouraging debate on the proposed changes to Thornbury High Street. The station itself is not for profit, but, of course, needs advertisers in order to cover their costs.

What else do they need? Well, Glyn says any volunteers would be welcomed with open arms and as little as an hour a week would be an enormous contribution. There are many small jobs such as helping create and maintain a spreadsheet/data base of all local charities/clubs, business administration, community engagement etc. Advocates are also needed, going to networking events, helping publicise the station, presenters, newsreaders, and numerous other contributions...for more information have a look at the station's website (www.thornbury.radio), under the Volunteers tab, for a more extensive list. 

Garlic Mustard



This is a member of the cabbage family and has historically been used for treating an array of conditions, leg ulcers, coughs and colds. It is also known as 'Jack by the hedge' or 'poor man's mustard' or 'hedge garlic'. Its flowering season is

April to July. It is very common and often seen growing along hedgerows, woodland, roadsides. It is very identifiable and grows to about 90cms with small white flowers with large triangular leaves. The whole plant but particularly the leaves give a strong smell of garlic when crushed. Please note this is an entirely different plant to wild garlic. At time of writing there are large numbers of this flower across our area. This photograph was taken in May this year alongside woodland near Elberton

This is one of my favourites, part of the borage family. The flowers are a vivid blue with a white centre which possibly may remind you of forget me not, but the colours are much more vivid, and the plant can grow between 30 and 100cms, so it is much taller. The

flowers of green alkanet are in dense curved sprays. It is not native and was introduced back in the Middle Ages for the red dye which can be produced from its roots. It is in flower from spring into early summer. As you can see in the photograph, bees love this flower. It is often seen in compact groups alongside hedges and woodlands. Its leaves are large and bristly at the base with smaller leaves higher up the plant. The leaves can also be an irritant so do not touch without gloves. Although excellent for wildlife it is possibly not a flower for the garden as it seeds readily.

Greater Stitchwort

Be warned - it is said that if you pick greater stitchwort you will start a thunderstorm, and in Cornwall it was believed that greater stitchwort was the property of the pixies and if you picked them they would become angry and enchant you. I thought it best I mention this at the beginning! They are a beautiful plant which you see along hedgerows, verges and in deciduous woodlands. Sometimes known as populus or poppers, because when ripe seed capsules make a popping sound. It also has many other names such as 'adders' meat', 'star of Bethlehem', 'daddy's shirt buttons', 'poor man's buttonhole' and 'wedding cakes', to name a few. Greater stitchwort belongs to the carnation family and has white flowers which can reach up to 50cms in height and they flower from April to June. Whilst it may appear that they have 10 white petals there is actually only 5 as each petal is split in half. The flower has great value to many flying insects, especially bees, butterflies and moths.





Green Force

Members of Green Force recently visited the Suez recycling plant in Avonmouth. The visit revealed a very contrasting method of coping with recycling compared with the ultra modern plant near Gloucester. (Featured in Meeting Point back in January)



The difference was that conveyor belts were manned and the sorting was done by hand; not a pleasant task. The end result of this sorting process was that individual elements such as plastic, paper, metal, and cardboard etc were baled up and each bale had a monetary value. Bales are sold on to further, more specialised plants, some very nearby but not owned or run by Suez. The money made pays for the running of the plant.

Did you Know.....about kelp?

Kelp is a seaweed, the ribbon kind which is found on our beaches. It is an ancient plant form which has existed for 23 million years. There are kelp forests on many shallower ocean beds, and it has an enormous capacity to absorb carbon dioxide. It can pull down billions of tons of CO2 every year. So there is a growing interest in kelp with a regard to assisting in correcting climate change. This can be done by establishing kelp farms. Spores are fed on to long lengths of rope and lowered into the sea where the kelp, in ideal conditions, can grow 2 feet a day. Kelp is then used as a heath additive and a medicine and in food. It can also be manufactured into blocks as a fuel.


