

Making Meadows - the continuing story Angela Hague

In support of the Parish's Making Space for Wildlife endeavour, in spring of 2022, a team of volunteers scarified areas of grass to sow a mixture of meadow flower seeds in the Vicarage Lane playing field and by the Old Down football pitch. In collaboration with the Parish Council's mowing team, the plan was to spare a larger area around these seeded areas from grass cutting to create mini-wildflower meadows.

Despite some promising foliage appearing among the grass, we did not see many flowers last summer. Therefore, a further plan was put into place in October 2022, when the areas were supplemented with yellow rattle seed. Yellow rattle is a semi-parasitic wildflower plant, which depletes nutrients that neighbouring grasses need. For this reason, yellow rattle is often described as the 'meadow maker' due to its ability to weaken vigorous grasses, allowing other wildflowers to flourish.



This May were very excited to see yellow rattle flowering in all of the areas that had been seeded. The reduced grass cutting has enabled other wildflower plants to become established. While the yellow rattle is now busy producing its seed, a tantalising mixture of green leaf growth can be seen, and oxeye daisies are flowering.

There are 25 different species of wildflower in the original mix of seed that was sown, so keep an eye out for what might be flowering next!



Parish councillors get involved in a broad range of village issues; in recent months the council have commented on planning applications, obtained funding for Coronation celebrations,

pursued National Highways for resolution of traffic congestion around the M48 bridge and the re-opening of Sandy Lane tunnel, identified priorities for South Glos. Council maintenance works across the parish and obtained Asset of Community Value status for the White Hart, amongst many other subjects. None of this would be possible without community representatives stepping forward to be Parish Councillors!

The parish council was successful in obtaining a grant towards putting on events in celebration of the Coronation. Residents of Littleton enjoyed a coffee morning (although apparently some prosecco may have been consumed as well!) whilst Elberton held a community picnic. 

More on The Last Flight of Sgt. Harold Clinton Cotnam

Following the article in June's Meeting Point, I was contacted by the knowledgeable local historian. Eric Garrett. He pointed me to his book. 'Olveston and Aust Parishes in the Second World War' published by the Olveston Parish Historical Society, which contains this photograph of the wreckage of Harold Cotnam's plane. If you look closely you can see about half a dozen people standing around and viewing the wreckage.



Eric's book also includes a list of similar military related plane crashes in the area, including the one detailed below, which was sent to Meeting Point by another local historian.


The Last Flight of Sgt. Harold James Robinson. John Stennard

When I read Nick Fear's feature 'The Last Flight of Sergeant Harold Clinton Cotnam' in last month's Meeting Point, it seemed very familiar. Some years earlier I had written a number of features for the Almondsbury Lich Gate magazine, articles which chronicled incidents occurring locally during WW II. One was of a remarkably similar and tragic event which also involved the fatal crash of a Hawker Hurricane fighter, piloted by a Royal Canadian Air Force

pilot with the first name of Harold. It took place over Almondsbury just a few weeks after Harold Cotnam's crash.

Sgt. Harold James Robinson of the Royal Canadian Air Force was a member of 87 Sgn, based at RAF Colerne, which was flying Hurricane IIC aircraft in a 'Night Fighter' role. In the late afternoon of 13th December 1941, Sgt. Robinson's Hurricane was seen to dive out of cloud at around 1500 ft. The Hurricane continued to dive until it hit the ground close to a farm on Tockington Lane. The aircraft was destroyed and the pilot killed on impact. It was thought Sgt. Robinson had lost control at around 10,000ft.

Sgt Robinson was 19 years old and the son of Henry James and Frances



Amelia Secord Robinson of St Catherines. Ontario. Canada. Sqt Robinson is buried in Canford Cemetery. Bristol, in the Commonwealth War Graves section. The inscription on his headstone reads, 'Yet, though thy smile be lost to sight, to memory thou art dear.'



Green Force

Do you know what 'Net Zero' means? Net zero means not adding to and reducing by 1.5% the level of greenhouse gases (GHGs) in the atmosphere. Green House Gases include carbon dioxide (CO2) and methane

(CH4) and the UK plans to reduce these gases to Net Zero by 2050.

CO2 is released when oil, gas and coal (fossil fuels) are burned. CH4 is produced through farming, and from landfill which is essentially our unrecyclable household rubbish. These gases cause global warming by trapping the sun's energy. Not all emissions can be reduced to zero, so those that remain need to be compensated for by removing greenhouse gases from the atmosphere. This is known as 'offsetting'. Natural offsetting methods include planting trees and restoring peatlands, eating less red meat and utilising more renewable energy resources such as solar and wind power.

What will net zero mean for individuals? Individuals will have to adjust their lifestyle and make improvements to help meet the target.

Have you thought of.....starting literally 'at home' and checking your house has good insulation especially roof and windows? Light bulbs can be changed to LEDs which use less energy. However small the changes, in the long run your energy bills will be lower and your house will be warmer. Also, any small changes made individually will add to the nation's 2050 target.

The broad bodied (see above) and four spotted chasers are dragonflies which feature in our local area from May to July. They are among the first dragonflies to be seen in summer and are a common sight on ponds, lakes and very slow-moving water such as our rhines. It is said that if you put a pond, however small, in your garden then a broad bodied chaser will be there in moments! We have a modest pond in our garden, and it was - along with red and azure blue damselflies - one of the first we observed. Each year since, we have had a male and female from the end of May into late June early July.

Identifying dragonflies and damselflies can sometimes be tricky so I thought as this species is one of the most identifiable, beautiful and common it may be of interest to Meeting Point readers. It also has some very distinct and recognisable behaviour. Writing on the 31st May, I was only going to write about the broad bodied chaser, but today on the 1st June, a four spotted chaser has now arrived in our garden. It is guite similar to the female broad bodied, so I will include both as I assume they will both be present in the area!

In very general terms, there are a number of species of large dragonflies (not including demoiselle and damselfly) these being hawkers, emperors, golden ringed, emeralds, club tail, chasers, skimmers and darters, each having a number of subspecies, far too many to discuss. In our area you can see some of these such as emperors, chasers, darters and hawkers. As with all insects

some types of dragonfly are found in certain types of habitat so, locally, you should be looking for those which would be supported by lakes or ponds and very slow moving water.

Dragonflies are amazing insects and have exceptional powers of sight and flight. Their wings are very light but extremely strong, they can reach speeds up to 22 mph. They are also very efficient hunters and a fearsome insect to others. Their larvae, which live in water for up to two years, are also efficient hunters. Thankfully, the ancestors of dragonflies (Protodonata), which grew to have wingspans of one metre, are not present today or we humans may have had an insect chasing us around for a meal!

As you can see from the photograph at the start of this article, taken on the 25th May in our Olveston garden, the male broad bodied chaser is very identifiable. Perched on long grasses, his key identification marks are the broad blue abdomen with yellow edges and the dark wing bases attaching its wings to its thorax. The female also has a broad abdomen with yellow edges, dark wing bases but the overall colour of the abdomen is a yellowish brown. Their behaviours are similar to the four spotted chaser. So there are distinct differences but it is easy to confuse the two especially on first sight.



This four-spotted chaser was photographed on May 27th at Poors Allotment Nature Reserve. Tidenham, Chepstow NP16 7LY, which is only about 25 minutes away from Olveston.

It is very difficult to distinguish between the male

and female four spotted chaser, but I believe it to be male from its perching behaviour. There are a few key points regarding differences in its identification compared especially to the female broad bodied chaser. The abdomen is narrower and the final third of the abdomen is shaded black. And crucially there are four spots across its fore and hind wings. When you look closely you can also see on its wings there is not the dark wing base, it is more a shaded orange. The behaviours of four spotted and broad bodied chasers are quite similar so again with regard to the female broad bodied chaser it can be quite easy to confuse it with the four spotted in flight, so wait for it to perch or lay eggs is my tip!

The males take up territorial perches, defending their territories, searching for females and food. They all fly very quickly and erratically which, when seen, is a very distinguishing feature. They can be very difficult to follow, but the male especially will always return to its perch. If you have a pond of any sort in your garden it is worth making sure there is a good perching point very close to the water about hip height. This could be a garden ornament or other garden structure especially one with a point, or you could use twigs or branches. This will encourage them to perch and stay in your garden and around your pond.

Both species mate in flight and this lasts only a few seconds but is quite noisy with a sound I can only describe as rustling or bristling which I believe to be their wings rubbing together. Both females lay their eggs in flight over water plants, by flicking their abdomen and eggs into the water. It is typical for the male of the species to be hovering close by at this stage protecting the female from other males whilst this happens. Ihave read that the females may sometimes mimic this to stop being harassed by males.



On our recent visit to Poors Allotment nature reserve we witnessed a spectacular event. There was a beautiful but chaotic scene of broad bodied and four spotted chasers mating over a natural spring pond. Whilst these were the majority species, there were also emperors and I believe hawkers in

amongst them. A crude estimate would be around 50 dragonflies who were all trying to claim territory, mate and lay eggs at the same point. It was impossible to photograph them in flight but you could when they occasionally perched or whilst egg laying. I have never seen such a display of dragonflies before and it was rather special. The photograph above shows a female broad chaser laying her eggs in flight.

So, you will hopefully read this in June, which will still give you time to go and look for these wonderful dragonflies. I am sure if you do that you will also see other damselflies and dragonflies in our area.

There are many sources of information you can use to identify them. https://british-dragonflies.org or www.wildlifetrusts.org to name but two. All have online information, and there are also many good books and guides available.

Thornbury and District Museum has revived a popular exhibition, Severn Salmon Fishing, originally curated a few years ago by the late Nick Large. It tells the story of salmon fishing in the River Severn, recording traditions and crafts handed down through generations. From the mid-1960s, Nick had been talking to the fishermen on the river. listening to stories of their tough working lives and taking many wonderful black and white photographs of them at work. Thornbury Orchard Group

The Thornbury Orchard Group cares for an old orchard. wildflower meadow. 'Bee Bank' and so much more. Our aim is to enhance the area for the local community whilst aiming to maximise biodiversity. We are part of Sustainable Thornbury and we have been rewilding the orchard since 2007. The wildflower meadow was created in conjunction with Buglife's B-Lines project in 2016, and we built a 'Bee Bank' in 2019 with support from South Gloucestershire Council (SGC) and GAPS local building suppliers. We partner with local and national organisations and we have won awards for our work, including the RHS SW in Bloom Best Native Planting (2017) and the WECA Bee Bold award in (2022).

You will find the orchard and meadow as you travel away from Thornbury on the Gloucester Road. It is just past the Anchor Pub and on the opposite side of the road. We hold a volunteer agreement with SGC, who own the land, and manage the area sustainably using scythes and electric tools where necessary rather than petrol driven. We normally meet in the Orchard on a Wednesday morning, but we are a very flexible and friendly group and do meet at other times. If you would like to visit, find out more or even volunteer please email thornburyorchard@sustainablethornbury.org.



July is a great month to get involved and there is plenty to see and do on site, with tasks great and small to suit everyone. We maintain the area, plant native plants to benefit local species and when safe to do so have been clearing the stream which is so important to biodiversity. There is a strong local bat population - an indicator of success- not to mention voles, mice and frogs in the meadow. You might see ground nesting bees and wasps on the bee bank, others visiting dead wood in the Orchard, a rose

chaffer on umbellifers (see photo above) and if you are very lucky - as we were last year- the red belted lacewing moth, known in the USA as the apple moth.


Our best source of security is in God, our Father. He is changeless, ever faithful, ever sure. The One who is utterly dependable. Our Rock.
