#### Deer on our Doorsteps

On a beautiful sunny day in January, whilst out walking locally, I was fortunate to photograph some wild roe and fallow deer, one of which was an infrequently seen 'white deer'.



The identification of this deer prompted me to do a little research in which the British Deer Society were very helpful. Both deer in the photograph were identified as young fallow bucks (kid males), one of whose coat was white, the other black. There are four recognised colour types for fallow deer, common (tan/fawn), menil (which is a paler colouration with white spots year-round) black and white. I was interested to find out if this deer would be classified as albino due to its white colouration and pink nose? No, was the answer to this question, due to its brown eyes. If it were albino it would have had red or pink eyes, and this would have made the sighting very rare. The classification for this deer is 'Leucitic White' which is representative of a wide variety of conditions resulting in the partial loss of pigmentation which causes white colouration of the coat and skin but not the eyes. Leucitic white deer are infrequently seen in comparison to other colour types. So, whilst not being a 'very rare' sighting it does come into the 'infrequent' category, which I was still very pleased about.

The two young fallow bucks were near to an adult fallow buck, showing its black winter coat and antlers. (See below) All three were grazing when I first saw them and I was fortunate to get these pictures, as very soon afterwards they ran for the cover of woodland.



Just a few minutes prior to photographing the fallow deer, I managed to get a picture of two roe deer which had been grazing on shrubs in an adjacent field. These were identifiable by the distinguishable buff rump. The jumping deer being identified as a mature doe (female) and the other a young doe which was likely to have been born last May or June.



I count myself as very lucky to have photographed these deer. It was a beautiful day in which there was plenty of wildlife to see. This reminded me how lucky we are to have such wonderful countryside and wildlife around us, which we can walk

So, if you see some deer out on your walks, a very basic guide to their identification is:

- Fallow deer are larger than roe deer and they have a distinctive black inverted horseshoe shape on their rump, with a tail and a black stripe.
- A roe deer does not have a tail but does have a distinguishable buff patch on its rump. In winter, however, the doe roe does grow a tuft of hair on its buff rump which can appear like a small white tail. So, be warned.
- The antlers of a fallow deer are larger than a roe deer and are flat and broader (palmate).
- A fallow deer also has a more elongated face than a roe, which has larger ears and large black eyes.

#### Aust Parish Council

At their January meeting, Aust PC agreed the budget for the 2021-22 financial year and set the precept (our portion of your council tax). We recognise that many parishioners may be facing financial difficulties during the pandemic and have managed to keep the precept very similar to last year. The total precept will be £5,369 which means for an average B and D property, the annual charge will be £23.55.

The PC has been discussing lots of other matters which affect residents, including planning applications, anti-social behaviour, noise disturbance, flooding, speeding and rebuilding of the verge beside Aust church. We liaise with South Gloucestershire Council and other bodies to ensure that issues are addressed, and that residents' concerns are put forward.

If you walk in Woodwell Meadows Nature Reserve, you may have noticed recent works around the badger sett. Badgers are a protected species, so when we were made aware of these works, we sought reassurance from South Gloucestershire Council (who manage the site on behalf of the PC) that the proper safeguards were put in place. SGC officers have since spoken to both the Badger Trust and the police Wildlife Crime team, who are satisfied that no harm was caused. The PC is now involved with drawing up a new management plan for Woodwell Meadows to protect this special site in the future. Please do come and take a walk around if you haven't recently — subject, of course, to whatever Covid restrictions are in place when you read this!

Parish Council meetings continue to be held via Zoom. The next will be on 9<sup>th</sup> March at 7:30pm. You can find details of what will be discussed and how to join on the agenda; these are posted on the community website a few days before the meeting. Alternatively, you can contact the Clerk, Emma Pattullo, on *austparishcouncil@gmail.com* or *01454* 837271.

For the last few months the Saturday Guardian has included a different kind of Sudoku puzzle. This has an additional rule: A number is given at the end of each row and column which tells us the total of all the digits which appear between the 1 and 9 in that row or column.

For example, if 8 appears at the end of a row there must be a total of 8 between the 1 and the 9, so either 1 8 9, 1 2 6 9 or 1 3 5 9 (with either order of 1 and 9 and any order of the sandwiched digits) must appear somewhere in that row. If the number at the end is 0 obviously the 1 and 9 are next to one another (a sandwich with no filling!)

#### Miles Grocott





#### Infectious Diseases

Tony Cherry

#### Local 19th century diseases

While we battle our own 21st century disease, local records from the 19th century highlight a raft of diseases that have disappeared or diminished, thanks to vaccination and disease control. Entries in the logbook of Thornbury British School (Gillingstool) are littered with absences from school as a result of infectious diseases. Mumps, scarlet fever, scarlatina, diphtheria, whooping cough and measles regularly affected attendance.

A form of lockdown occurred in September 1883, when the local Sanitary Authority closed the school for a fortnight because of scarlet fever. The school was closed again, for a month, in 1886 because of measles and, the following year, the National School was closed for the same reason.


The Infant logbook of the British School in December 1890 has the following entry: 'an epidemic of measles has broken out ... there is much danger to patients taking colds after the measles leave them'. This entry is followed by an entry on 5th January 1891: 'I have just heard of the deaths of two of my little ones, viz Charles Yarnold aged 6 and Albert Curtis aged 6'. Sadly, these were not the only children's deaths recorded.

Parental expectations, because of the impact of these diseases, were such that they would routinely enrol their children into the insurance provided by Friendly Societies immediately the child was born. Friendly Societies were colloquially known as 'sickness and burial clubs.'



#### Disease in the workhouse

Thornbury workhouse was a hothouse for spreading diseases, as there was no social distancing. In 1842, it had to be white limed and the governor was instructed to use chloride of lime as required – a sure sign that there was an infectious disease in the house. In 1848, the buildings committee of the workhouse committed to building a separate building for those with infectious diseases. An infectious disease which was curable was 'the itch'. All workhouses had at least one 'itch' ward to accommodate those who had scables.

Orphaned children from Thornbury were put into the care of local families and. in June 1863, the Poor Law Board received a complaint that a child named Baker, lately sent out of the workhouse to reside with George Russell (Olveston), showed an eruption of the skin after about a week. He also had head lice.

The matron was asked to explain. She said that a short time before Baker left the house, many of the children (including Baker) had experienced a slight eruption of the skin. This had been shown to the workhouse medical officer. who said it was merely the hot weather. He had administered medicine and the eruptions appeared to be cured. She also claimed that all the children sent out at the same time as Baker had been thoroughly cleansed and their heads well combed the night before they left. In other words, the children had been up to scratch.



# From The Elms Farm to Haw Lane, Olveston, in 1959. Bruce Farr

This article first appeared in Meeting Point March 2018. Since many of us are doing much more local walking these days, we thought it might be interesting to have another chance to compare the walk from Tockington towards Olveston — as described below - with what we see on the same route today.

How many people travel the road between Tockington and Olveston? It is not very far, maybe half a mile, but so much change has taken place over the last fifty years. I wonder if there will be as much change again over the next fifty?



I remember 59 years ago.....

On the left of the main entrance to The Elms Farm, where now just the gateposts remain, there was an overgrown shrubbery with several tall trees and a lean-to single storey shed. Now there is pull-in parking with a high clipped hedge. Where now there are rebuilt farm buildings, then there was a rickyard with three round ricks of corn sheaves. The main field entrance has been moved to beyond the pond and horse chestnut tree, where conkers were gathered each autumn on the way to and from school.

First on the right was Court Farm with a laurel hedge and cow stalls in a low single storey building with pantile roof. Between farm buildings and The Parish hall, running parallel to the road was a stand of mature elm trees in the grass verge next to what was the main entrance to the farm and barns beyond. On the roadside there was an elevated platform where eight to twelve churns of milk would be placed for collection seven days a week by a twin axle flat-bed lorry. Now it is the site of two established family homes.

The Parish Hall had no flat roofed extensions then, just the red brick main building with a grass verge outside. There was a low wall between the verge and front door, where we would sit awaiting the arrival of the once fortnightly film show.

On up the road on the right there were no car parks or tennis courts, just Tockington's favourite tobogganing hill. Mature trees lined the road on either side, mainly elm, making the road much more enclosed. And in the spinney on the left was Miles Well. It is now filled in for safety reasons, but it was used in the past to refill the steam lorries and road rollers and was also renowned for its healing powers as an eyewash.

On over the brow of the hill there were no pavements once you went past the lane to Westfield Cottage. Even then it was a hazardous crossing, though there were very few vehicles, the most respected being the lorries from Olveston quarry (Lewis Rugg in those days) carrying four, or maybe six, tons of material at a time in twin axle tipper lorries. There were also more country buses in those days!

Across the road was a wild bank of bramble and stinging nettles underneath the trees (again mainly elm), where now there is a terraced garden and a smart drive entrance. The view, as now, was of Olveston and beyond to the River Severn and the Welsh hills. At night it was all darkness away from the village, apart perhaps from the odd light in Chepstow and Beachley

At the bottom of the hill there was no bus shelter, no Police Station either, just a market garden behind the wall. On the opposite side of the road, no clipped front lawns but a paddock where the bungalow now is and a high stone wall on the roadside to the crossroads, behind which an ancient apple orchard gave shelter to the odd bullock or heifer.

#### Flights of Fancy: Finches

One of our commonest birds is the chaffinch - the male with its pink breast and grey head and its more sombre mate who is dressed in brown. The first sign that they are around is their sharp "spink" note as they perch. To recognise them is also easy due to the white bars on their wings and on the outer edges of their tail which flash as they fly off.

Also common is the greenfinch, which as you may guess, is green, olive green to my eyes and with a bright yellow edge to its wings. The male is quite distinctive although his mate is less brightly coloured. They will chew away at



sunflower seeds as long as they feel safe. As March progresses we will hear the male "churring" from the top of a tree or a high place; look in the highest places. The prolonged repetition of the song is very distinctive and, dare I say it, a little irritating after a while.

However, the most beautiful visitor is the goldfinch which will visit, especially if you provide Niger seed. They usually






