

SPACE FOR THE BUILD OF THE BUIL

Holes Help Hedgehogs

Melinda Evans

One of the best things about moving to another country is discovering the resident wildlife. I remember seeing my first ever hedgehog, and I was smitten! Like lots of wildlife, hedgehog numbers have fallen considerably, so much so they are now listed as vulnerable to extinction.

They really do need some extra help now.



There's lots we can do to help them, but in villages and towns the best thing we can do to help hedgehogs is to create hedgehog highways – holes in fences – through our gardens. Hedgehogs travel around one mile every night in

their quest to find enough food and a mate. Our enclosed gardens get in the way of their plans.

Nowadays, fence panels can be purchased with gaps already in place, like this one (above). If you are replacing your fences anytime soon, see if you can incorporate one or two of these panels in your new fence. Or you can DIY your own hole. Using a drill, cut a hole of around 13cm x



13cm (the size of a CD). This will be too small for nearly all pets.



If you've got a concrete gravel board, putting a small ramp or steps in, and then cutting a hole in the wooden panelling does the trick. As shown in these photos, sometimes an old piece of pipe can help, or digging



Fungi: The 5th Living Kingdom -

Part 2

Part 1 of this article appeared in last month's magazine.

Back in September 2021 I became interested in fungi, having seen so many different examples when I was out walking. Since then, I have photographed several different species. To help with identification I have used the Collins Fungi Guide and the NHBS, First Nature and Woodland Trust websites.


The photograph below is of Oyster Mushroom (Pleurotus ostratus) and was taken in December 2021, just north of Chepstow in Piercefield Woodland Nature Reserve. The cups grow between 4cm and 20cm and it lives on dead



wood. It is said to be widespread and common, but this is the best display I have seen. There were larger but broken specimens nearby. It is sabrobic, gaining its nutrients from the dead wood. At the beginning of February I photographed some smaller specimens on a fallen tree on The Common at Olveston.

The next photograph, over the page, is of Turkey Tail (Trametes versicolour) and was photographed in December near Oldbury on Severn. Versicolour translates as 'of many colours' and you may have seen these fungi in other shades such as black, green and yellow.

It is a bracket fungus and grows both on live and dead wood and it is very common. It can be seen throughout the year. It is a very beneficial fungus and is a powerful antioxidant and can be used in medication to fight certain cancers and improve gut bacteria. They used to be used as table decorations, which may explain a bit of a mystery - a friend identified an impressive group of black Turkey Tails on a log on the roadside near Tockington. I went to photograph them the very next morning and they were gone, log and all! So maybe they are now sitting on somebody's table.



The Scarlet Elfcup (Sarcoscypha austriaca) is a winter fungus. Although its distribution is said to be widespread, it is not very common, so I was very excited when we came across it in January in Piercefield Woodland Nature Reserve. Whilst being very small, it looked exceptionally beautiful against the green of the

moss. They can grow between 1cm and 5 cms. (The one in the photograph is approx. 1.5 cms) They are found in damp woodland areas on decaying branches or twigs and are often -as in the photograph - buried in moss. On

releasing their spores, they apparently release a 'puffing' sound, but I would imagine you would need exceptional hearing for this. European folklore states that wood elves drank the morning dew from the cup and Native Americans used the fungi to stop bleeding and placed them on the naval of newborns to promote healing. Also, in past times these, like the Turkey Tail, were used in the UK as table decorations. Just in case there are any experts reading, there is another species, Ruby Elfcup (Sarcoscypha coccinea), which is very similar.

In early February I found this fantastic specimen of Artists Bracket Fungi (Ganoderma applanatum) in woodland near Awkley. It was an amazing sight, at approximately 50 cm diameter.



It is a common perennial fungus and is mainly found on fallen beech trees. It is a saprobic fungus and can live for many years. Each year's growth is marked by a ridge, which can be seen in the photograph. This one I believe had stopped growing as there was no white rim on its edges. There were younger specimens on the same tree much more lightly coloured. It is called Artist Fungi because on younger specimens if the surface is scratched its colour will change from light to dark meaning you can etch lines on its surface. When they release spores, they do so in their billions and a brown dust on surrounding vegetation can be seen when this occurs. Other common names are Artists Conk, Shelf Fungus or Bears Bread and it is said to contain powerful immune tonics to create balance in the body's immune response.

I hope this article encourages you to take some time, when you are out on your walks, to look again at the variety of fungi that we have in our area. They really are fascinating once you start looking!





A Happy End to 2021 for FOMS

2021 finished on a happy and festive note for The Friends of Marlwood School. First up were some festivities and treating the wonderful staff to a Christmas Brunch, which transformed the last Monday of term with a colourful and delicious feast. Then, Christmas arrived early as we received the great news that FOMS had been successful with not one but two grant applications.

First was Olveston Parish Council, who generously awarded FOMS nearly £1400 for much-needed equipment for the school. The new equipment includes a new outdoor table tennis table for the pupils, which will be available for use in break times. For the design and art department FOMS will now be able to purchase a desktop spray booth, which is a specialised spray-painting unit with an inbuilt extraction system and filters to remove fumes from the air. A new bass guitar and bass amplifier will also be purchased for music classes with the funds. Mrs Jenkins-Pick, Faculty Leader for Design and Art (DART) said: The DART faculty was delighted to receive the grant for the spray booth and are looking forward to getting it up and running as soon as possible. It really will make a huge difference to the quality of student outcomes, and this will be especially helpful as the students will be able to achieve professional quality standards.

The news of another grant followed swiftly, and FOMS was delighted to hear it had been awarded funds by Alveston Parish Council to purchase new food processors for food and technology classes. Louise Berington, Food Technology teacher said: I would like to say a huge thank you for the grant to buy food processors for Marlwood School. This will provide greater opportunities to our students, allowing them to experience a wider range of food preparation equipment and techniques.

Young Carers Action Day March 16th

Did you know that many local children and young people are caring for someone at home? Young carers are just kids, yet they care for someone at home who could not manage without their help. The average age of a young carer is just 13 years old, and some are as young as 8. Local charity, Carers Support Centre, is raising awareness for Young Carers' Action Day, which is on Wednesday 16th March. The charity supports voung carers with assessments, one-to-one and family support, groups and activities.

This year's theme is taking action on isolation. Young carers carry a heavy responsibility, caring for sick and disabled family members. They are often isolated and lonely, they miss out on opportunities and are bullied. Carers Support Centre's annual survey found 75% of local young carers feel isolated and 25% said that they have felt more isolated in the last year because of Covid.

Carers Support Centre's specialised young carers service tackles isolation head on. Regular carers groups, trips and activities bring local voung carers together to take a break and have some much-needed fun. The need for young carers to connect with others, get support and feel able to reach out is so important. "I used to keep feelings and thoughts to myself, but now I am really open and honest about how I feel." Georgia

To mark the day, the charity is working in partnership with South Gloucestershire Youth Network and local secondary schools to run an interactive fair. This will feature workshops by organisations that tackle social isolation. Young carers will have the opportunity to take a break from their caring role, have fun together, and connect with local support services too.

From Olveston Parish Magazine June 1887

This extract is an account of the celebrations held locally for Queen Victoria's Golden Jubilee. Many similarities, and some differences, between the events in 1887 and those that are being planned for Queen Elizabeth's Platinum Jubilee in 2022.

"The celebration of Her Majesty's Jubilee on Wednesday June 22nd began with the firing of cannon and imitation canon, and a joyful peal from the bells, at an early hour. We were favoured with a bright, sunny day, not oppressively hot. At 11 am the Thanksgiving Service (was held, and)..there was a good congregation. After the service the children, headed by the Tockington Band, and accompanied by many of the parishioners marched with flags flying, through Tockington to Old Down. The large 'Flower Show' tent had been fetched from Frenchay the night beforeand set up early in the morning. The Infant classroom had been capitally arranged for the Tea and (the big tent) for the dinner, to which the first company of about 250 sat down at one o'clock, the Vicar saying grace. There was plenty of excellent beef (roast and boiled), ham, and veal, and cold plum pudding, and a pint of beer for each guest, or mineral water if preferred...Company after company sat down till some 700 or 800 had dined, and a good dinner was sent to all aged and infirm people who were unable to be present. At the infant classroom some 500 children and women had an excellent tea. The sports began at 4pm...great amusement was caused by the Obstacle Race, Jumping in Sacks, Donkey Race and two races by women after pigs. There was no lack of amusement, steam roundabout, swing-boats, cocoa nut throwing, rifle gallery, were all more or less patronised. Then came the Fireworks, a good display, contributed by the ladies of the Parish, and a grand Bonfire of some 650 faggots. Dancing was kept up till about 1 or 2 am. Everyone was there who could be there, and all appeared thoroughly to enjoy themselves, while there was no quarrelling or drunkenness to mar the pleasure of the day. Our hearty thanks are due to those who found the money, and to the committee who arranged such a capital programme.....May the



Big Changes for the League of Friends


