

It's time to dust off those binoculars!

Have you ever walked along the Severn estuary and seen flashes of white appearing and then disappearing quickly, low across the water? It is quite a common and often spectacular sight to see from late autumn until early spring. What you are seeing are two of the birds which migrate to our shores to spend winter here before returning to their breeding grounds in spring - the dunlin and the turnstone. The birds are quickly twisting and turning, showing their white bellies in a coordinated flight. They may also be joined by other birds such as the ringed plover.



It is a fairly common sight to see these birds locally, especially up around the power station reservoir walls at Oldbury on Severn or New Passage. The photographs in this article were taken on a very bleak morning at Oldbury on Severn at the reservoir wall, just before high tide in January 2022. As the estuary is so tidal it is best to observe around an incoming or outgoing tide about an hour either side of high tide. I look up BBC website tide times for either Beachley or Sharpness, depending on my whereabouts.

Turnstones (see photo over the page), which winter on our shores, are remarkable birds. Their breeding grounds are in Greenland and northeast Canada. So, every year they migrate to the UK as we have a much milder climate in winter, a long and fantastic journey. The turnstone does not breed in the UK so most return to their breeding grounds every year. Those who are

non-breeding may choose to stay. They arrive in late autumn so it is possible you may now be able to see this bird. It is also possible to see some turnstones in August and September. These are birds migrating further south from Scandinavia and Russia. These earlier birds may have a more 'orangey'



plumage. It is exclusively a coastal bird so you will not see it inland. It will find all the food sources it needs along the shores and tidelines of our local estuary.

The dunlin (see below) is the UK's most common small wading bird. There are 3 types: the UK breeding bird, the passage migrant, and the winter visitor.



There is a breeding population in the UK of approx. 9600 pairs, but numbers increase significantly between October and March to approximately 350,000

by the arrival of the winter visitors. Most of the dunlins you will see locally have migrated from Scandinavia and Russia and are here for winter. The UK breeding birds will themselves have migrated further south for winter to southern Europe or Africa. When these winter visitors arrive around October, they will begin to form large flocks and it is then you may begin to see them form murmurations across the water.

There are of course many other birds you may spot locally in winter: wigeon, teal, black tailed godwits, curlew, redshank and lapwing are just a few. We also have the fantastic resource of Slimbridge not far from us, where in winter you can go to the bird hides and observe huge numbers of migratory birds out on the wetlands and in the lakes. So, dust off those binoculars and go out and look! It is worth it.



Green Force

About 30 people came to the meeting which Green Force held last month to learn all about our carbon footprints. Those present completed a pro-forma sheet or did it on an app on their phones using https://footprint.wwf.org.uk. What emerged very strongly was that using air travel for whatever reason, often for holidays, added many points to the count. A big thank you to Martyn Suker for a most informative and professional video presentation and to Rod Williams for his technical expertise.

So, what are our objectives now?

- 1) to increase awareness of the need for individuals to reduce their carbon footprint.
- 2) to identify ways in which to reduce that footprint.
- 3) to encourage changes in lifestyle.

We can now add three more R's to our list: Restraint, Replace, Regulate, all of which are realistic options to put into practice.

Have you thought about?...... increasing the insulation in your house, adjusting the thermostat, eating less meat and minimising flying? All these options will lower your carbon footprint.

Did you know that?..... manufacture of cement adds hugely to CO2 in the atmosphere. Buildings could possibly be timber framed instead.

A Local Hero

Athelstan Paul Bush (who preferred to be known as A Paul) was born on the 11th June 1892 in Clifton, Bristol, and he moved to Tockington in 1931. He was educated in Bristol and in 1905 entered the Royal Naval College, Osborne, where he was given the rank of Midshipman in 1909, moving on to Dartmouth Naval College. As well as being well qualified in seamanship, he had a skill with languages, speaking French and German. His first posting was to the



armoured cruiser HMS Drake, and he gained further experience in the Mediterranean on other naval vessels. A Paul continued his naval studies in service and in 1912 qualified for certificates in general seamanship and navigation. He also passed examinations in engineering, gunnery and the use of torpedoes. As a result, he was promoted to the rank of Sub-Lieutenant.

On the outbreak of the Great War, A Paul was promoted to Full Lieutenant and posted to a destroyer, HMS Spitfire. In December 1914 the ship supported the repulsing of a German naval raid on Scarborough. Spitfire was in combat in the Battle of Dogger Bank in early 1915 and The Battle of Jutland in the

late spring of 1916. A Paul was injured in the latter, having taken command after his Captain was incapacitated by shelling. His injuries were treated on board, but he insisted on staying on the vessel to continue command. The French President honoured him with the Legion of Honour. He was soon transferred to the destroyer HMS Offa, part of defensive screening for The Grand Fleet.

In May 1917 A Paul was promoted to the command of the P25. 'P boats', developed in The Great War, were small fast armed vessels which relieved larger destroyers from escort duties. They also played a part in anti-submarine warfare.

A Paul was promoted again in March 1918 to command the destroyer Orcadia. Within days, A Paul came to the notice of the Admiralty for attacking enemy submarines with 'promptness, skill and good organization'. He ended the war still in command of the Orcadia and kept this post until 1920. A Paul was awarded the Distinguished Service Order in the summer of 1919 for distinguished services during the war. He was formally invested at Buckingham Palace.

With the decommissioning of HMS Orcadia in 1920, the adventurous A Paul volunteered for service in Australian waters and went on attachment to the Royal Australian Navy. He was promoted to the rank of Lieutenant Commander in 1922. Part of his duties involved returning to London, where he met and married Prudence Cheney, the widow of a Captain in the Royal Artillery who had been killed in 1916. Prudence had a daughter by her first marriage and she and A Paul soon had another daughter to add to the family.

A Paul, now a family man, was still attached to the Royal Australian Navy and applied to return to Home Waters. In 1924 his request was granted, but fate and perhaps a naval sense of humour posted him to the China Station in the Far East where he performed his duties well. In 1925 Prudence visited him in Hong Kong, leaving their daughters with grandparents in Clifton. Perhaps as a result A Paul requested a return to the UK, which he finally achieved in 1926. After serving on two further vessels in 1928 he was discharged to land duties and settled down to family life, first in Caterham and then Plymouth, where sadly Prudence died in the autumn of 1930.



PINPOINT

A Paul returned to his Bristol roots and moved to **Tockington Court** in Tockington. At his own request, on the 11th of June 1932, he retired from the navy with a Commander's rank and on the same day he married Elma Rose Pomerov Salmon, the only daughter of the Salmon family of

Tockington Manor, in Saint Mary's Church in Olveston. Their marriage was heralded as a 'society wedding' with locals prepared to be 'thrilled to the bone'. The coverage of the day reported local houses being decorated with flags and bunting. The area was renowned for celebratory floral arches, and



two were erected over roads in the area. One on New Road (near where Green Lane Garage is now situated) read 'Health and Happiness' and 'Fondly United' and




the other, in Tockington, 'God Bless the Happy Pair' and 'Good Luck'. The couple had a reception at Tockington Manor and honeymooned in Norway. A large banner across the entrance of Tockington Court welcomed them home.

Settling down in the area, A Paul took a senior management position with The Port of Bristol Authority. He was appointed as a Justice of the Peace for Gloucestershire. On the outbreak of the Second War, he sought a naval reappointment, but this was rejected because his civilian position was vital for the war effort. A Paul continued to press for further service and in June 1944 he reported for duty on the staff of the Naval Flag Officer in Cardiff. But the navy then undertook a general reorganization and the Cardiff base closed. A Paul left his post in October 1944 and went into full and final retirement.

A Paul and Elma continued to take an active part in local life and were much respected. A Paul was on the committees of Old Down Cricket Club and the local bowling club. He was a supporter of the Bristol Zoological Society and the Berkley Hunt. He assisted the Bristol Sea Cadets, was a Governor of Colston's Girl's School, treasurer of Colston Boy's and St. Monica's Home. He was the Chair of the Bristol Downs Commoners' Committee and a Vice President of the local Young Farmers Club. A Paul was elected to The Society of Merchant Venturers in Bristol and was its treasurer from 1944 until 1962, relinquishing the post to become the Master.

Athelstan Paul Bush died on the 13th of September 1972 and is buried in St. Mary's church, Olveston. Elma died on the 28th of July 1982.

A Paul accomplished much in the service of his country during his 80 years, both at sea and on shore. I hope he may have approved of the epithet, 'A Local Hero'.

A Message from Olveston and Tockington Methodist Church

The June edition of Meeting Point kindly reported on our celebration of the 200th Anniversary of Olveston Chapel. Now, rather differently, we need to share with you two items from our recent Church Council.

The first is the decline in our active membership post-Covid, which is significantly diminishing our capacity to sustain our usual round of activities. This leads inevitably to the second item, the future of our properties.

Most of you will be aware that we have four separate buildings – two in Tockington and two in Olveston. We have sought to maintain and manage them for the benefit of the community as well as for our own purposes, and they have been well used. With great reluctance, the recent meeting of Church Council judged that in the longer term we will be unable to do so; instead, we will have to be selective in what we retain and what we let go. This does not affect the 2022/2O23 year, and no dates beyond that have yet been considered. However, Church Council recognises the need to determine the longer-term future for our properties by Summer 2023.

Our Church Council members are the managing trustees of our buildings and have the power to decide what we keep. However, it is the Methodist Connexion's custodial trustees who have the final say on what should be done with any proceeds resulting from the release of property. In this situation we will have a full opportunity to make our own proposals to the custodial trustees on what would be in the best interests of our local Methodist church and community, and of course we will do so.

If you would like to share your views on the choices we face, we will be very pleased to hear from you. It will help if you do so by written note or email (see below) and it would be helpful to hear from you by the end of 2022.





Second World War Stories

A reminder that, at this meeting, which is open to all, we are going to show a selection of 10 minute edited filmed interviews carried out by Christina Wheeler, project officer for Second World War Stories, a recent South Gloucestershire Council-led project, carried out in association with the museums of South Gloucestershire.

In these films, Christina asked older South Gloucestershire residents for their memories of the Second World War. Sadly, some of the participants are no longer alive.



One of the most moving stories is that of the late Hella Hewison, interviewed in her Downend retirement home in her 90s, with her memories still very sharp. Hella, pictured here with her father, was born in Berlin on 7th January 1925 to German Jewish parents. She witnessed Kristallnacht and escaped on the Kindertransport. In the film, she reads the Red Cross letter from her

mother saying goodbye before going to a concentration camp. Hella's mother, father and grandmother were all killed. Once in Britain, Hella studied hard and became the first non-British nurse at Southmead Hospital.

Other stories, told in an impressively matter-of-fact way, tell of romance, work, and family members going off to war. Come along and hear some first-hand testimonies of local people's experiences.

This year it seems that we are going to be colder and poorer (well, most of us at least) and that we are due to experience a very 'Bleak Midwinter', because, as Advent and Christmas approach, we face difficult choices about which of the many season's 'must haves' we can do without.

It's not a new problem; St. Paul himself explored his personal standing and future uncertainties in Chapter 13 of his first letter to the people of Corinth. He went on to define what love is and realised that love should be at the heart of everything he did; and that when all his uncertainties and unknowns were stripped away he saw that only three things matter:

"And now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; and the greatest of these is love."

Faith that we have a God who determined to create a new relationship between him and ourselves and who sent to earth a child, a man, a Saviour.

Hope because this Saviour grew up to persuade us of this new relationship and way of living, this 'New Testament', by which we live today, knowingly or unknowingly.

Love, being the 'greatest of the three', is because that is the basis of the new relationship, which is that we should love and trust in God and love one another.

And so, whatever we can or cannot manage to make out of this 'holiday season' we can still keep faith in the one who inspired the celebration. At the same time, we must remember that, if we do everything with love in our hearts, then all will be well; and that we can keep hope that things will get better.

Then the only thing that will be 'bleak' this winter ought to be the weather!


